ORDINANCE NO. 2024-XX

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RICHLAND, WASHINGTON, AMENDING CHAPTER 22.10 OF THE RICHLAND MUNICIPAL CODE RELATED TO CRITICAL AREAS TO ADD A NEW SECTION 22.10.395 ENTITLED VARIANCES.

WHEREAS, the City has need, from time to time, to amend the Richland Municipal Code (RMC) to bring it into alignment with best practices; and

WHEREAS, critical areas ordinances commonly include a variance provision that allows the City's quasi-judicial decision-maker to grant legally allowable deviations from the strict letter of established land use regulations; and

WHEREAS, the City's Critical Areas Ordinance, codified as Chapter 22.10 RMC, contains a specific variance provision for wetland buffer widths, but is devoid of a general variance provision; and

WHEREAS, a survey of other codes throughout Washington state revealed that most cities and counties include a variance provision in their critical areas ordinances.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Richland as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. Chapter 22.10 of the Richland Municipal Code, entitled Critical Areas, as first enacted by Ordinance No. 48-93, and last amended by Ordinance No. 16-21, is hereby amended to add a new section as follows:

RMC 22.10.395 Variances.

A. The Administrator shall process variance requests according to a Type II procedure delineated in Title 19 RMC, or any amendment thereto. The burden of proof shall be on the person requesting the variance to bring forth evidence in support of the variance.

- B. The Hearing Examiner shall grant a variance if the person requesting the variance demonstrates that the requested variance conforms to all of the criteria set forth below:
- 1. That special conditions and circumstances exist that are peculiar to the land;
- 2. That literal interpretation of the provisions of this chapter would deprive the person seeking the variance of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties conforming to the terms of this chapter;
- 3. That the special conditions and circumstances do not result from the actions of the person seeking the variance;
- 4. That the granting of the variance requested will not confer on the person seeking the variance any special privilege that is denied by this chapter to other lands, structures, or buildings under similar circumstances;

- 5. That the variance requested is the minimum necessary to afford relief; and
- 6. That affording relief though approval of the requested variance will not create significant impacts to critical areas and resource lands and will not be materially detrimental to the public welfare or contrary to the public interest.
- C. In granting any variance, the Hearing Examiner shall prescribe such conditions and safeguards as are necessary to secure protection of critical areas from adverse impacts.
- <u>Section 2</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect the day following its publication in the official newspaper of the City of Richland.
- <u>Section 3</u>. Should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, that decision shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

<u>Section 4</u>. The City Clerk and the codifiers of this Ordinance are authorized to make necessary corrections to this Ordinance, including but not limited to the correction of scrivener's errors/clerical errors, section numbering, references, or similar mistakes of form.
